and to **remember** the words of the Lord Jesus, how he said, It is more blessed to give than to receive." (Acts 20:35). James, Peter and John in giving Barnabas and Paul the "right hand of fellowship" encouraged them to "**remember** the poor" (Gal. 2:9-10). Jude wrote, "But beloved, **remember** ye the words which were spoken before of the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ."

The Ephesian Christians were told to **remember** that though they had once been "without Christ" and "without God" in the world that now "in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ." (Eph. 2:11-13). Of all the memories we hold dear the one expressed in this passage is the most important. For sometimes we do forget where we once were spiritually—separated from God by sin and without hope. Some need to heed the words of Revelation 2:5, "**Remember** therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works..."

How thankful we should be that God is willing to forget our sins and "**remember**" them against us "no more" (Hebrews 8:12).

Memory is a wonderful ability given to mankind by God. Of course, not all memories are good ones. Yet, how many of us would willingly give up our ability to remember just to avoid the memory of bad things. The Bible says much about remembering. Israel was commanded to "remember the Sabbath Day to keep it holy" (Ex. 20:8). They were commanded at one point to put fringes or tassels with blue thread in the corners of the garments so that when they looked upon

those tassels they would "remember all the commandments of the Lord and do them...." (Num. 15:38-40).

Jesus spoke of the need of remembering. On one occasion he told his listeners to "Remember Lot's wife." (Luke 17:32). He emphasized to his disciples the need of remembering the word that he had spoken to them (John 15:20; 16:4).

The inspired Paul in addressing the Ephesian elders declared, "I have showed you all things, how that so labouring ye ought to support the weak,
